N.B.—(a.) In Ships whose Sea-going Complement includes only a Chief or other Gunner or Boatswain (T.) and no other Gunner or Boatswain, the Torpedo Warrant Officer will receive one Store Allowance only at the rate laid down for his own set of (Naval) Stores.

(b.) In Ships whose Sea-going Complement does not include a Torpedo Officer the Chief or other Gunner or Boatswain will receive one Store Allowance only at the rate laid down for his own set of (Naval) Stores.

Store allowances are not payable to officers on passage or borne to close accounts.

In Ships in commission payments of store allowances to officers for charge of stores other than their own (e.g., to a Gunner for charge of Boatswain's stores) are not to be made on the ledger, but must be authorised by the Accountant-General. In ships in reserve, payments are to be made quarterly, or on discharge, on Form S. 9.

Any payment of store allowance for a harbour establishment appearing in the above schedule is to cease on the transfer of such establishment to barracks.

The payment of store allowance to the Warrant Officers of gunboat tenders to Coast Guard Ships and of ironclad tenders to gunnery school ships is to be contingent upon their rendering accounts as in a ship independently commissioned.

Store allowance will be payable to the Gunner and Boatswain of H.M.S. "Black Prince" only so long as the Admiralty see fit to maintain an establishment of sea stores on board.

All allowances for charge of stores and rendering accounts, to any officers whatsoever, are granted conditionally upon the duties being correctly and properly performed, and satisfactory accounts being duly rendered, and passed at the Admiralty.

Although, for the sake of convenience, the allowances are in some cases paid periodically, prior to the examination of the accounts, the officers who receive the payments will be liable to refund them, if, on examination of the accounts, the duties should appear to their Lordships not to have been correctly and properly performed.

The pay (full, half, or retired) or pension of the officers will also be held liable for the value of any stores lost or damaged, which the store allowance may not be sufficient to cover.

1418 FULL PAY, ALLOWANCES AND DEDUCTIONS. [CHAP.

Chief and other Gunners, &c., promoted, gratuity.

1418. Should a Chief Gunner, Chief Torpedo Gunner, Chief Boatswain, or Chief Carpenter be promoted to one of the higher grades of Commissioned Officers, or a Warrant Officer to be a Commissioned Officer, other than a Chief Gunner, Chief Torpedo Gunner, Chief Boatswain, or Chief Carpenter, he shall be entitled to one hundred pounds as a gratuity to provide himself with a proper outfit. Petty Officers promoted to be Warrant Officers, shall receive twenty-five pounds for the same purpose. Applications for the above gratuities are to be made direct to the Accountant-General of the Navy.

Gratuity to Petty Officer granted an Acting Warrant.

2. Petty Officers serving in Ships on Foreign Stations, ordered to act temporarily in proper vacancies as Warrant Officers, are to be allowed a gratuity of Twenty Pounds (20*l.*); this amount is to be paid to them by the Accountant Officer of the Ship to which they belong, under the authority of the Captain, with the Commander-in-Chief's sanction. Should they revert to their former rating, and be subsequently appointed in the acting rank of Warrant Officer, they will not be entitled to the payment of a second gratuity.

When confirmed.

3. Should Officers so appointed acting, be confirmed, an additional sum of Five Pounds (5*l.*) will be paid to them, on application to the Admiralty, to make up the total gratuity of Twenty-five Pounds.

Uniform and Messing while acting.

4. Petty Officers thus temporarily promoted, may at their option, until confirmed or superseded, continue to wear their Petty Officers' uniform, and Mess with the Chief Petty Officers; but if they so elect they will receive no gratuity, unless confirmed; they are, however, to be allowed to use the Warrant Officers' Cabin to which they may become entitled.
