Bemoaning our lot and our pay whilst retaining our cravings.



SERVICE PAY, CHARGES AND PENSIONS

PAY

- 1. The basis of pay of the Armed Forces was changed from 1 April 1970 by the introduction of the military salary. The new scales of pay were established with the aid of job evaluation techniques and comparisons with earnings in civilian life in December 1969. They were paid in full from 1 April 1970 to all married personnel and all cadets, apprentices and junior Servicemen, but at rates abated by amounts ranging from £0.35 to £2.00 per day to single personnel. These abatements ceased from 1 April 1971 in accordance with the decision announced at the time of introduction of the military salary.
- 2. In the normal course the next review of the pay of the Armed Forces is due to take effect from 1 April 1972 and is to take into consideration the level of earnings in civilian life at the end of 1971. The Armed Forces Pay Review Body has begun work with a view to reporting by April 1972. In the meantime the Government have approved as an interim measure a general increase in pay from 1 August 1971 which represents an improvement of 7% in the current rates.
- 3. The new rates of pay are detailed in Appendices I to III and are to become effective for both single and married personnel from 1 August 1971. To provide a comprehensive list of all pay rates of the Armed Forces, those for senior officers and medical and dental officers are included at Appendices I to III although their pay is not to be increased from 1 August 1971 for the reasons given at Paragraphs 6 and 7 below.

Officers

4. The annual pay of male Officers on normal rates is to be increased by the following amounts:—

5. The new rates of pay for chaplains, officers of the legal services and others on special rates of pay are shown in the appropriate tables.

Senior Officers

6. The increases in pay are not applicable to officers in ranks above that of Brigadier (or equivalents in the other Services). Their rates of pay were increased from 1 January 1971 as recommended in Report No. 157 of the National Board for Prices and Incomes (Cmnd 4513) and this scale is in future to be considered by a separate Review Body concerned with the salaries of senior appointments in the public service.

Medic al and Dental Officers

7. Similarly the increases in pay do not apply to medical and dental officers because below the rank of Brigadier their rates of pay are assessed by comparison with the earnings of general practitioners in the National Health Service, which are subject to a separate review.

Other Ranks

8. The pay of ratings, soldiers and airmen is generally to be increased by the following weekly amounts:—

Women's Services

9. The pay of the Women's Services is to be increased to provide the improvement of 7% and to maintain the existing relativity of 87% of the equivalent men's rates.

Reserve Forces

10. The new rates of pay are to be issued to members of the Reserve Forces when they are entitled to daily rates of pay under current regulations.

Additional Pay

11. The scale of flying pay for specialist aircrew officers is to be increased from 1 August 1971 by the same percentage as normal rates of pay. The new rates of flying pay for specialist aircrew are as follows:—

Other rates of flying and other forms of additional pay remain unchanged.

Cost

12. The cost of the increases in pay in 1971/72 is estimated at about £29,000,000.

CHARGES

Food Charges

13. The charge for food provided to single Servicemen living in barracks has been re-assessed and is increased from 36p to 39p per day from 1 August 1971.

Accommodation Charges

14. The increases in rents charged for occupying married quarters proposed by the National Board for Prices and Incomes were not implemented in full from 1 April 1970, except the rate charged for the smallest quarters occupied by other ranks without children. As the rates of pay are to be increased by 7% from 1 August 1971, the rents of married quarters are to be increased by the same percentage from the same date. The rents to be charged do not exceed the full rates proposed by the National Board for Prices and Incomes. Details of the rents to be charged are set out in Appendix IV. Accommodation charges for single personnel living in barracks are unchanged because they were implemented in full from 1 April 1970.

Receipts from Increased Charges

15. The increased charges for food for single personnel and married quarter rents are estimated to provide an extra £2,200,000 in the year 1971/72.

PENSIONS

Retired Pay and Pensions

16. The rates of retired pay and pensions are also to be increased by approximately 7%. The new rates are set out in Appendix V and they will apply to officers, ratings, soldiers and airmen whose first day of eligibility for retired pay or pension is on or after 1 August 1971. The rates of retired pay for senior officers are not to be changed because increased rates were introduced from 1 January 1971 at the same time as their pay rates were improved, vide paragraph 6 above.

Cost

17. The cost of the improvements in rates of retired pay and pensions is estimated at about £1,200,000 in 1971/72.
