## BRITISH MILITARY TRAIN

(BERLIN - BRAUNSCHWEIG - BERLIN)

FROM BERLIN (read down)

POINTS OF INTEREST
(Travelling in a forward direction)

The British Military Train (The 'Berliner') departs from Charlottenburg Station in the British Sector of West Berlin.

On leaving, the Funkturm comes into view to your right.

Enters the 'Corridor' at Griebnitzsee. The 'Wall', look-out towers and posts, and armed uniformed personnel of the DDR can be seen to the right and left.

At Potsdam the angine is detatched and searched and on East German Train Guard jains the train. On deporture the following buildings can be seen on your right:

The partially ruined Potsdam Palace and the Inter Hotel.

On approaching Werder (o: Wilepark), an engine shed (where the Kaisers' personal engine was once housed) comes into view. At Werder there is a Sovict Artillery Camp on the right.

At Brandenburg the oldest Shunting Hump in Germany, and one of the oldest in the world, can be seen to the right.

At Kirchmöser is O large Soviet Tank Repair Workshop and a Tank Training Area. In the distance a radar installation con also be seen. The Workshop and Training Area are to the right and the radar installation is to the leif.

On this stretch of track the frain is travelling at a speed in excess of 100 kph .

On leaving Biederitz be alert in order to see a large 'Rock' under a tree known locally as the 'Biederitz Busch'. This marks the foundation of the German Socialist State and is to your left.

The 'Berliner' crosses the River Elbe ond enters Magdeborg where the twin spires of its' Cathedral can be seen. A prison, believed to be for political prisoners, can be seen on leaving Magdeburg. This is to

## POINTS OF INTEREST

[Travelling in a forward direction)

The 'Berliner' arrives of Charlottenburg Station in the British Sector of West Berlin. Passengers detrain.

The sighting of the brightly-lit Funkturm on your left is indicative of journeys' end.

Leaves the 'Corridor' af Griebnitzsee. The look-out towers and posts, and can be seen to the right and left.

The Inter Hotel and the

POINTS OF INTEREST
|Travelling in a forward direction)

On arrival at Marienborn, the OC Train, TCWO and Russian Interpreter alight from the train and present all the documents to a Soviet Army Officer for checking. Sherly afterwards the train leaves the 'Corridar' and proceeds into West Germany.

On arrival of Helmstedt, the first station in West Germany, the engine is changed and the East German Train Guard is replaced by one from the West.

On arrival at Braunschweig passengers detrain and continue their respective journeys by other ogencies.

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## TO BERLIN (read up)

## POINTS OF INTEREST

(Travelling in a forward direction)

At Marienbern the OC Train, TCWO and Russian Interpreter alight and present all documents to the Soviet Army Officer for checking. The 'Berliner' enters the 'Corridor' which consists of concrete posis, barbed-wire, minefields and look-out lowers/posts.

At Helmstedt, the last station in West Germany, the engine is changed and the West German Train Guard is repiaced by one from the East.

The 'Berliner' is shunted into the sidings at Braunschweig where it is cleoned and prepared for its' return fourney to the 'divided city' of Borlin on the same doy.
