## EXPLANATION.

In accordance with Treasury Minute dated 15<sup>th</sup> February, 1940 (Cmd. 6176), the Estimates for Navy Services for 1941 were presented in token form, a gross provision of £110 with Appropriations-in-aid of £10 being taken under each Vote. The authority of Parliament is now sought for the appropriation of receipts not exceeding £16,000,000 in aid of expenditure out of Navy Vote 1. This figure represents, so far as can be foreseen, the total estimated receipts to Navy Votes, 1941, but in view of the impossibility of an exact forecast of the allocation of these receipts among the several Votes, the whole of the receipts are provisionally estimated for under Vote 1. The sanction of Parliament will, in accordance with Section 4(2) of the Appropriation Act, 1941, be sought later to apply excess receipts on other Votes towards making good the deficiency between the estimated receipts under Vote 1 and the actual receipts under that Vote.
