BADGES AND CAP RIBBONS

0410. Rating badges

1. WARRANT OFFICER

- a. The Warrant Officer (Royal Arms) badge in gold wire is worn on both cuffs of blue uniform jackets and mess jackets with the bottom point of the badge 5in from the end of the sleeve.
- b. An anodised metal version of the Royal Arms badge is worn on both sleeves of white tunics and mess jackets with the bottom of the badge 3½in above the end of the sleeve.
- c. Detachable sleeve-type shoulder badges with the Royal Arms embroidered in multi-coloured rayon on black are worn on the white collar attached temperate shirt, white tropical shirt, blue heavy wool jersey, RN raincoat and blue working shirt. Except that:
 - (1) the anodised badge on a white strap is worn on the right wrist with white tropical shirts without shoulder flaps;
 - (2) a gilt metal version of the Royal Arms badge is worn centrally in the tie with white temperate shirts without shoulder flaps (immediately below the V of the lapels when a jacket is worn).
- d. Warrant Officers are also distinguished by their cap badge (*see* 0411).
