Service addition to Warrant Officers' pay.—Warrant Officers who on the day before promotion to warrant rank were in receipt of more than five increments of pay for man's service under the new pay code for men (or who would have been in receipt of such increments had their man's service been performed under the conditions of the new pay code) receive a special addition to the normal Warrant Officer rate of pay, to be known as Service Addition, amounting to 6d. a day for each increment in excess of five, provided that the total of basic pay plus normal increments plus Service Addition does not at any time exceed 23s. 0d. a day.

Pensioner Bonus.—Pensioner ratings granted temporary warrant rank continue to draw their pension whilst so serving, and receive, in addition to their normal Warrant Officer pay plus Service Addition (if any), a special allowance of 2s. 0d. a day, to be known as Pensioner Bonus.

(iv) FLYING AND ASCENT PAY

Flying Pay is payable continuously at the rate of 3s. 0d. a day to officers of the rank of Lieutenant-Commander and below who are qualified as pilot or observer, so long as they remain appointable for full flying duties.

Officers under training to become qualified Pilots or Observers receive flying pay of 2s. 0d. a day, payable continuously.

Unqualified officers undergoing short air courses receive Ascent Pay of 2s. 0d. for each day on which they make a solo ascent.

(v) SUBMARINE PAY

Submarine Pay is payable at the rate of 4s. 0d. a day to officers of the rank of Lieutenant-Commander and below, when appointed for duty in or with submarines.

(vi) SURVEYING PAY

Surveying Officers receive surveying pay at the following rates, payable continuously from the date of first appointment as Surveyor or Assistant Surveyor, so long as they remain in the Surveying Service.

(vii) MEDICAL OFFICERS' SPECIALIST PAY

(viii) DENTAL OFFICERS' SPECIALIST PAY

Specialist pay at the rate of 5s. 0d. a day is payable to Dental Officers of the rank of Surgeon Commander (D) and below whilst appointed for duty in certain specialist posts.

(ix) OFFICERS OF THE WOMEN'S ROYAL NAVAL SERVICE

As a provisional measure, pending the settlement of permanent post-war conditions of service, officers of the Women's Royal Naval Service are eligible for the following duty and specialist allowances :—

Officers appointed for other than temporary duty receive the annual rates shown above. Officers appointed for temporary duty will be paid at the annual rates in the first instance, but, if the appointment proves to be of less than 91 days' duration, payment will be adjusted to the daily rate on termination of the appointment; otherwise the annual rate will continue.

Note.—With the exception of the allowance for Radar and Air Radio duties, Duty and Specialist allowances are not payable concurrently with Admiralty Special Duty Allowance.

Specialist Allowance.—Officers who are qualified in Communications and officers who have passed the Wartime Staff Course are eligible for continuous specialist allowance of 1s. 4d. a day unless they permanently come to be employed as specialist officers.
