Service addition to pay of Commissioned Officers (Branch List).—Commissioned Officers (Branch List) who on the day before promotion to officer rank were in receipt of more than five increments of pay for man's service under the new pay code for man (or who would have been in receipt of such increments had their man's service been performed under the conditions of the new pay code) receive a special addition to the normal Warrant Officer rate of pay, to be known as Service Addition, amounting to 6d. a day for each increment in excess of five, provided that the total of basic pay plus normal increments plus Service Addition does not at any time exceed 23s. 0d. a day.

(iv) FLYING AND ASCENT PAY

Flying Pay is payable continuously at the rate of 3s. 0d. a day to officers of the rank of Lieutenant-Commander and below who are qualified as pilot or observer, so long as they remain appointable for full flying duties.

Officers under training to become qualified Pilots or Observers receive flying pay of 2s. 0d. a day, payable continuously.

Unqualified officers undergoing short air courses receive Ascent Pay of 2s. 0d. for each day on which they make a solo ascent.

(v) SUBMARINE PAY

Submarine Pay is payable at the rate of 4s. 0d. a day to officers of the rank of Lieutenant-Commander and below, when appointed for duty in or with submarines.

(vi) SURVEYING PAY

Surveying Officers receive surveying pay at the following rates, payable continuously from the date of first appointment as Surveyor or Assistant Surveyor, so long as they remain in the Surveying Service.

Specialist pay at the rate of 5s. 0d. a day is payable to Dental Officers of the rank of Surgeon Commander (D) and below whilst appointed for duty in certain specialist posts.

(x) HARD LYING MONEY

(Note.—An abatement of 3s. a day is made from the above rates in certain circumstances, e.g., if an officer is provided with official quarters which he occupies with his family, or if he is in receipt of the married rates of Local Overseas Allowance or Mission Allowance).

(ii) Married officers under 25—a marriage allowance of 56s. a week.

The above rates are not applicable to National Service entrants who enter the R.N. on or after 1st January, 1947, who receive a lower rate of marriage allowance.

If the officer has been promoted from the Lower Deck or from the ranks, he may receive the rate of Marriage Allowance (excluding the Allotment from his own pay) in issue on the day before the date of promotion if this is more than 56s. a week.

W.R.N.S. officers who are widows with children are eligible for marriage allowance at the same rates and under the same conditions as widower naval officers.

Supplementary Marriage Allowance.—Subject to detailed conditions laid down in Regulations, all married officers, who were serving as officers on 30th June, 1946, and who were, on that date, in receipt of marriage allowance (including children's allowance) of 6s. 0d. a day or more at Schedule A rates, are eligible to receive a Supplementary Marriage Allowance at the following daily rates:—

(xiii) RATION ALLOWANCE

(xv) LOCAL OVERSEAS ALLOWANCE
